

Penetrating Judgment - *Ability to see through all deception*


Holiness and Purity - *Fire reveals and Purifies*

3. Feet like burnished bronze


Stability / Strength / Eternality – His Kingdom will never end







Tolerance



Tolerance is the capacity to accept, respect, or endure differences in beliefs, practices, opinions, or behaviors—even when they conflict with your own—without hostility or interference.

Is my love matched by personal holiness?


Am I spiritually alive—or just busy and respectable?

Tolerance is the allowable range of deviation from a perfect value.



There is a tolerance of .060mm and .087 mm for the clearance between the cylinder wall and the piston skirt.

That means I have .027 mm of wiggle room!
