# Six clear markers that define Biblical preaching:

- **1. A life impacting sermon is bathed in prayer** (1:14).
- **2.** A life impacting sermon is empowered by the Holy Spirit (2:1-3).
- **3.** A life impacting sermon is straight-forward (2:16-21).
- **4.** A life impacting sermon is Bible-based (2:16ff).
- **5.** A life impacting sermon is Christ-centered (2:22-36).
- **6.** A life impacting sermon is personally relevant (2:22-36).

God's conviction in one's life is always about these two things:
1) An understanding of what we've done
2) An understanding of what it means **Yoh Shirato** 

"The more I tried to do right, the more I realized how sinful and unable to deal with my own sin."

"[When I] asked Jesus to forgive my sins - to surrender. I totally understood what surrender means ... and confessed my sins...I heard almost an audible voice say, "You are forgiven." I felt like a huge load came off of my back. I could fly. It was a glorious moment"

### Genuine conversion is characterized by three critical elements:

Deep Conviction (v. 37)
 True Repentance (v. 38)



## repent/ /rə'pent/ verb

Speaks of a change of purpose; of turning from sin to God Complete and total reversal of my direction

#### Is baptism linked with repentance? (v. 38)

- 1. Interpretation principle *(analogia scriptura)* no passage when correctly interpreted, will teach something contradictory to the rest of Scripture (John 1:12; John 3:16; Acts 16:31).
- 2. After condemning the ritualistic religion of the scribes and Pharisees, Jesus would certainly not have instituted His own.
- 3. Throughout Acts, <u>forgiveness</u> is linked to repentance, not <u>baptism</u>.
