Why should we honor Mom? a. God commanded it!

"honor thy father and thy mother, as the LORD thy God hath commanded you"

b. It's good for you!

"that thy days may be prolonged, and that it may go well with thee, in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee."

Continuing to nail your parents (or anybody) to a wall of bitterness years after the fact, hurts you more than it hurts them.

Failing to honor your parents...

- 1. impacts the way your children will respond to you.
- 2. drains away your capacity to love others.
- 3. builds walls in our lives.
- 4. affects you physically.

Rejecting our parents is robbing from ourselves.

Honor could include these things (D. Rainey):

- 1. Choosing to place great value on your relationship with them
- 2. Taking the initiative to improve your relationship
- Obeying them until you've established yourself as an adult
- 4. Recognizing what they've done right in your life
- 5. Recognizing the sacrifices they have made for you
- Praising them for the legacy they are passing on to you
- 7. Seeing them through the eyes of Christ, with understanding and compassion
- 8. Forgiving them as Christ has forgiven you
