Jesus' Prayer Pattern

- Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:2) "Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be your name."
- Garden Prayer (Luke 22:42) "Father, if it is your will, take this cup away from me; nevertheless not my will, but yours be done."
- Cross Prayer (Luke 23:34) "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do."
- **Final Prayer** (Luke 23:46) "Father, into your hands I commit my Spirit."
