

Cycle of the Judges

The people rebel Judge dies **God is angry Peace** Oppression by Salvation through enemies chosen judge The people cry out (repentance)

Nazarite Requirements

- No wine or strong drink
- No haircut
- No touching a dead body
- No unclean food

Samson's 2 Fatal Flaws

- 1. He was governed by sight, not by faith or obedience (Judges 14:1).
 - ■He had a "eye" problem and an "I" problem.
- 2. He disregarded the God-given authority that could have protected him (Judges 14:2-3).


If we do not discipline our flesh, it will render us powerless!

- 1. The Downward Journey (Judges 14:7, 10)
